<p><b>About this unit of competency</b></p>	<p><b>Description of Provide cardiopulmonary resuscitation course:</b>                  This unit of competency specifies the skills and knowledge required to demonstrate first attack firefighting equipment. <p><b>Assessment requirements</b></p>	<p><b><u>Physical Requirements:</u></b>                  It is important to note that the unit of competency requires a level of physical ability to meet the evidence requirements for assessment. Specifically manual handling of firefighting equipment.</p> <p><b><u>Language Skills:</u></b>                  All students must be able to demonstrate an accurate verbal report which would be given to emergency services and workplace supervisor.</p>

<p><b>Delivery and Assessments</b></p>	<p>Students attend a 4 hour face to face program to demonstrate their knowledge and skill with an approved assessor. A summative assessment is conducted and recorded at this time.</p> <p>Learners will be assessed on the following topic areas</p> <p>Skills:</p> <p>To demonstrate competency, a candidate must meet the elements and performance criteria of this unit by demonstrating and explaining the correct and safe use of first attack firefighting equipment, including:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• selecting an appropriate extinguisher and demonstrating correct extinguishment methods for the following simulated fires:</li> <li>• one class A, C or F type fire involving two different types of equipment or materials</li> <li>• one class A, C or F type fire involving potentially energised electrical equipment</li> <li>• one class B type fire</li> <li>• one class D type fire</li> <li>• attacking a fire using a fire hose reel where the fire is located more than 10 metres from the installed location of the hose reel</li> <li>• attacking a fire using a fire blanket.</li> </ul> <p>Knowledge topics:</p> <p>To be competent in this unit, a candidate must demonstrate knowledge of:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>▪ basic methods of locating a fire</li> <li>▪ correct use of fire extinguishers and hose reels on different classes of fire and implications of incorrect use</li> <li>▪ how fire can be spread by conduction, convection, radiation and direct burning</li> <li>▪ how water pressure influences the discharge distance for hose reels</li> <li>▪ key actions in a fire emergency, commonly known by the acronym RACE:</li> <li>▪ rescue</li> <li>▪ activate alarm</li> <li>▪ confine fire</li> <li>▪ evacuate or extinguish</li> <li>▪ meaning of secondary damage</li> <li>▪ reasons why cooking oil and fat fires require special attention</li> <li>▪ theory of fire, including the triangle of combustion</li> <li>▪ types and operation of fire protection equipment classified as first attack equipment.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Training materials and resources</b></p>	<p>On the day of the training course, learners will have access to our training equipment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• actual or simulated work environment</li> <li>• portable firefighting equipment.</li> </ul>
<p><b>Assessment submission process, support and outcomes</b></p>	<p><b>Assessment Outcomes: Competent or Not Competent</b></p> <p>For any learner who is unable to satisfactorily complete all assessment tasks, the assessor will attempt to make reasonable adjustments to the methods of assessment. If the learner is deemed not competent, they will need to re-sit the training course and additional fees will apply.</p>
<p><b>Recognition of Prior Learning</b></p>	<p>Students choosing to undertake RPL will need to be sent an RPL guide for their course.</p> <p><b>In order to be eligible for RPL, the student must demonstrate <i>currency</i> in that particular subject. I.e. a student cannot submit evidence from 5 years prior and request it be applied directly to their new competency. They must show how they have since applied those skills and that they are current.</b></p>
<p><b>Course completion</b></p>	<p>Once assessed in all areas of the course and competency demonstrated, learners will be issued a Statement of Attainment for CPPFES2005 Demonstrate first attack fire fighting equipment.</p> <p>This Unit of Competency is Nationally Recognised Training from Health Training Package and it is recommended that it is updated every 2 years.</p>
