

UETTDRRF06 Perform rescue from a live LV panel course description



<p>About this unit of competency</p>	<p>Description of Perform rescue from a live LV panel course:</p> <p>This unit covers the performance of rescue procedures from live low voltage (LV) apparatus, not including overhead lines and underground cables in the workplace. It specifies the mandatory requirements of rescue from a live LV panel and how they apply in the context of transmission, distribution or rail work functions. It encompasses responsibilities for health, safety and risk management processes at all operative levels and adherence to safety practices as part of the normal way of doing work.</p> <p>The application of the skills and knowledge described in this unit may require a licence/registration to practice in the workplace subject to regulations for undertaking of electrical work.</p> <p>Applicable Industries:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Emergency responders • Mining • Construction • Many more
<p>Training Program</p>	<p>This Perform rescue from a live LV panel is delivered as a 6 hour face to face training course, plus breaks.</p> <p>We offer weekly public attendance first aid courses at our Mayfield West training centre or we can come to your workplace.</p> <p><i>If your organisation is interested in a private / in-house booking to have this course delivered to a group of staff, please contact our head office to discuss booking options. <p>Assessment requirements</p>	<p><u>Physical Requirements:</u></p> <p>It is important to note that the HLTAID and UETTDRRF competency standards do require a level of physical ability to meet the evidence requirements for assessment. The physical requirements include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Getting down to the ground and back up • Lifting and moving equipment around to demonstrate skills • Scenario based activities where a student simulates the role of a first responder. <p><u>Language Skills:</u></p> <p>All students must be able to demonstrate an accurate verbal report which would be given to emergency services and workplace supervisor.</p>
<p>Payment options</p>	<p>In order to secure your seat in the course, payment must be made at the time of enrolment. We offer the follow payment options to students our public courses:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Credit card • EFT • Cash
<p>Language, Literacy & Numeracy requirements</p>	<p>This course combines plain English, videos, photos, and questioning to ensure all learners are able to have the best possible chance at comprehending the required knowledge and developing first skills that will be needed in an emergency. If you believe you will need assistance due to your Language, Literacy or Numeracy skills, please contact our head office before enrolling to discuss your training needs.</p>
<p>Identification</p>	<p>All students must bring ID with them to the training course. Photo ID is the minimum requirement (e.g. Drivers Licence, Passport or similar).</p>

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<p>Delivery and Assessments</p>	<p>Students attend a 6 hour face to face training in Perform rescue from a live LV panel to demonstrate their knowledge and skill with an approved assessor. A summative assessment is conducted and recorded at this time.</p> <p>Learners will be assessed on the following topic areas</p> <p>Skills:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • applying relevant work health and safety (WHS)/occupational health and safety (OHS) requirements, including the use of risk control measures • inspecting and placing rescue equipment • identifying and labelling the isolation point • performing a rescue from a low voltage (LV) panel in accordance with workplace procedures. <p>Knowledge topics:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • emergency procedures for the rescue of a victim from a live LV panel encompassing: • inspection of rescue equipment • assessing hazards to rescuer, victim and others • isolation procedures, where appropriate • safe approach distances SAD appropriate to rescue from a live LV panel • involvement of external emergency services • emergency procedures required for the rescue of a victim from a live LV panel encompassing: • placement of rescue equipment • controlling hazards to rescuer, victim and others • maintaining SAD appropriate to rescue from a live LV panel • removing victim to safe location/place of safety.
<p>Training materials and resources</p>	<p>On the day of the training course, learners will have access to our training equipment:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Resources for assessment must include access to: • a range of relevant exercises, case studies and/or other simulations • relevant and appropriate materials, tools, facilities, equipment and personal protective equipment (PPE) currently used in industry for performing rescues from a live LV panel • applicable documentation, including workplace procedures, relevant industry standards, equipment specifications, regulations, codes of practice and operation manuals.
<p>Assessment submission process, support and outcomes</p>	<p>Assessment Outcomes: Competent or Not Competent</p> <p>For any learner who is unable to satisfactorily complete all assessment tasks, the assessor will attempt to make reasonable adjustments to the methods of assessment. If the learner is deemed not competent, they will need to re-sit the training course and additional fees will apply.</p>
<p>Recognition of Prior Learning</p>	<p>Students choosing to undertake RPL will need to be sent an RPL guide for their course.</p> <p>In order to be eligible for RPL, the student must demonstrate <i>currency</i> in that particular subject. I.e. a student cannot submit evidence from 5 years prior and request it be applied directly to their new competency. They must show how they have since applied those skills and that they are current.</p>
<p>Course completion</p>	<p>Once assessed in all areas of the course and competency demonstrated, learners will be issued a Statement of Attainment UETTDRRF06 Perform rescue from a live LV panel.</p> <p>This Unit of Competency is Nationally Recognised Training from Health Training Package and it is recommended that it is updated every year.</p>
